### Section 4

## What Happens If You Miss a Deadline

**Vacate deadline (June 26):** The other party may file an emergency motion for enforcement or contempt. A contempt finding can result in fines, attorney fee awards, or in extreme cases incarceration. The court can also grant a writ of possession to remove you from the property.

**Child/spousal support (ongoing):** Missed payments accrue as a judgment. Texas courts can enforce support orders by wage garnishment, license suspension, and contempt proceedings. Interest accrues on unpaid amounts at 6% per year (Tex. Fam. Code sec. 157.267).

**Pre-Trial Conference (September 8):** Failure to appear can result in a default on contested issues, dismissal of your claims, or contempt. Court dates in family-law cases are rarely rescheduled on short notice.

**72-hour travel notice:** The most commonly missed obligation in parenting orders. Failure can result in a modification proceeding or contempt. Set a phone reminder for every planned out-of-state trip.

### Optional Cross-Document Findings

#### **RCO-001 - Relief-vs-grant reconciliation**

Supporting document: The motion or petition that led to this order

##### **Cross-document flag: Cross-document inconsistency**

The court order (Paragraph 11, Page 7) grants Petitioner exclusive use of the 2023 Honda CR-V.

The supporting document (Petitioner's Motion for Temporary Orders, Page 4, Item 3) did not request exclusive use of the vehicle; it requested only that Respondent refrain from encumbering it.

Possible explanations include: the court exercised sua sponte authority to make the allocation; the order was prepared by Petitioner's counsel and the vehicle allocation was added during drafting; a clerical error in the motion omitted the vehicle request.

**Suggested next step:** Ask your attorney to clarify whether the vehicle allocation was intentional and whether a motion to clarify or reconsider is warranted.

#### **RCO-002 - Opposition coverage**

Supporting document: The opposing party's response or opposition

##### **Cross-document flag: Cross-document inconsistency**

The court order (Paragraph 6, Page 4) sets child support at \$1,150/month with no deviation finding.

The supporting document (Respondent's Response, Page 2, Paragraph 4) raised an objection that Petitioner's income was overstated by approximately \$800/month and requested a deviation hearing; the order does not address this objection or include a deviation finding.

Possible explanations include: the court considered the objection and rejected it without a written finding (common in Texas temporary orders); the objection was withdrawn before the hearing; the issue will be addressed at the final trial.

**Suggested next step:** Consult a licensed attorney in your state about whether to request a clarifying finding or raise the income issue at trial.

### RCO-003 - Order-history consistency

Supporting document: Prior orders in the same case

#### Cross-document flag: Cross-document inconsistency

The court order (Paragraph 12, Page 7) grants parenting time every other weekend starting May 9, 2025.

The supporting document (Emergency Protective Order entered March 3, 2025, Paragraph 2) contains a travel restriction prohibiting either party from taking the children outside Travis County without court approval; the new order does not reference or expressly supersede this restriction.

Possible explanations include: the EPO's travel restriction was intended to be superseded by the temporary orders and the court assumed it without saying so; both restrictions are intended to coexist; the EPO lapsed by its own terms before the temporary orders were entered.

**Suggested next step:** Consult a licensed attorney to confirm whether the EPO's travel restriction is still in effect alongside the new parenting-time order.

### RCO-004 - Written-vs-spoken consistency

Supporting document: Hearing transcript or minute entry

#### Cross-document flag: Cross-document inconsistency

The court order (Paragraph 8, Page 5) requires Respondent to vacate within 14 days.

The supporting document (Hearing transcript, June 12, 2025, Page 47, lines 3-8) reflects the judge stating 'I'll give Respondent 30 days to vacate' before the recess during which the order was drafted.

Possible explanations include: the parties agreed to a shorter period during the recess and the judge approved it off the record; a transcription error occurred in the hearing record; the written order supersedes the oral ruling under Texas law.

**Suggested next step:** Consult a licensed attorney about whether to file a motion to clarify the record or whether the written order controls as entered.

### RCO-005 - Filing alignment

Supporting document: The other party's most recent filing

#### Cross-document flag: Cross-document inconsistency

The court order (Paragraph 15, Page 9) restricts both parties from disposing of community property above \$500.

The supporting document (Petitioner's Amended Motion, Page 3, Paragraph 7) requested only that Respondent be restricted; the order extends the restriction to both parties symmetrically.

Possible explanations include: the court exercised its equitable authority to apply the restriction symmetrically; a drafting error in the order; Petitioner intended a mutual restriction and the motion's one-sided language was an oversight.

**Suggested next step:** Note that this restriction applies to you and to Petitioner equally. No action required unless you believe the symmetric application was unintended.
